

Peter Cairns and his apprentices provided a magic lunch and Craig provided 3 lovely platters of smoked trout, salmon and local cheese and pate for nibbles prior to the main feast.

After lunch the fishing became surprisingly harder but Conor and Tony were going fish for fish. Dave Boyack and Nicky were moving up the leader board and Majid started his run. One fish provided the frustration for the day with Peter Golding and Tony throwing everything at it, Peter with every fly he could think of.

Jill held off all comers despite another 5 plus pounder from Scott. James Mulvay landed a 7 pounder but not on a competition fly so Jill was safe.

CVFFC suggested clubs should start to maintain catch records of rivers/lakes they intend to put submission in for as this will assist


in building a strong case to support the submission.
